Field Trip to the Wells National Estuarine Research Reserve, Wells, ME

The Wells Reserve is a 2,250-acre research, education, and recreation facility, with seven miles of hiking trails that provide access to woodlands, fields, wetlands, beach, and dunes. We'll explore the diverse habitats of the Reserve and hear about the various research projects taking place on-site.

Hike Mt. Major, West Alton, NH

Join us as we hike to the top of this rocky summit with extensive views of Lake Winnepesaukee and the Belknap Range. If the weather is clear, we will also be able to see the White Mountains!
